Executive Summary

Jintan, a city of Jiangsu Province, is located in the most dynamic Yangtze River Delta in China. The emerging city has been called "Land of Fish and Rice" and "Treasure Place of East Yangtze River" thanks for its abundant resources and comfortable living environment.

In recent years, Jintan GDP has increased by some 18% each year, and has grown into a modern industrial city with four pillar industries, namely, Photovoltaic, Textile & Garment, Mechanical & Electronics, and Salt Chemicals.

Presently, Jintan has made great achievement against fierce competing market in attracting Foreign Investment, with the number of foreign investors growing by more than 50 and amount of FDI by more than 30% in the last three years. Currently in Jintan there are many MNCs including Ingersoll-Rand, Oerlikon, Mueller, Maya, Shachihata, and Jintan has become a gathering of famous brands like Gap, Polo, Lee, and Valentino.

DTZ believes the core competence of Jintan is a bunch of factors including low cost (in particular, land, HR and logistics), industrial cluster, cross-regional cooperation, salt resource etc. Jintan is one of the most potential city for investment now and in the near future.

Overview

Jintan is within Jiangsu Province and enjoys mild climate and a strategic geographic position in the Yangtze River Delta.

- Jintan is a county level city in Jiangsu Province, listed as one of "Top 100 Counties" in China.
- The city is an emerging industrial city located in the heart of the Yangtze River Delta (YRD).
- ☐ Jintan's total population accounts for 540,000, of which urban residents number 220,000. The city includes seven sub-level towns, and one provincial-level development zone.
- ☐ The total administrative area is 976 sq. km which consists of 20% hills, 20% water, and 60% usable land. The urban area of Jintan approximates 20 sq. km.

Location

Jintan enjoys a unique geographic location and advantageous economic and ecological location.

Geographic Location

Jintan is located in south Jiangsu Province at the junction point of Jiangsu, Anhui, and Zhejiang provinces. It is within 2 hours' drive to 17 major cities of the YRD including Shanghai, Nanjing, Hangzhou, Wuxi, Changzhou and Wuhu. Jintan is 105 km and 220 km to Nanjing and Shanghai respectively.


Regional Economic Circle

Jintan is at the heart of China's largest economic engine, Yangtze River Delta, and within the border area of metropolitan circle of Suzhou–Wuxi–Changzhou and Nanjing metropolitan circle.

The circle within 5 hours to Jintan accounts more than half of China's economic output and one third of China's population or 435 million people.

■ Ecological Zones

Jintan city possesses 4 eco-galleries connecting with "S" shaped urban green belt: Maoshan Eco-Gallery, Fangshan Mountain Eco-Gallery, Changdang Lake Eco-Gallery, and North Jintan river system Eco-Gallery. The river network in this zone are dense and linked with lakes. Within this area there is also a wetland reservation.


■ Cultural History

- Jintan was called "Jinsha" in ancient times, and is regined by "Wu" and "Yue" kingdoms in the Spring and Autumn period. In the reign of Queen Wuzetian in Tang Dynasty, AD 688 it changed its name to "Jintan".
- ☐ The birth of talents brings glory to Jintan. These includes the mathematician Hua Luogeng, poet Chu GuangXi, anthropologist Wu Dingliang, the great doctor Wang Kentang, and the translator Wang Weike.


Specialties

Jintan Per Capita GDP (RMB)




■ Jintan Economy

Jintan's economy has been steadily growing by an average 18%, dominating by secondary industry.

- □ In 2009, GDP in Jintan reached RMB 29.0 billion and fixed assets reached RMB 14.52 billion. Per capita GDP reached RMB 49,980.
- ☐ In 2009, industrial value added achieved RMB 14.28 billion accounting for 49% of GDP.
- Jintan's fastest growing and biggest industry is the secondary industry, particularly the four pillar industries: Photovoltaic, Mechanical & Electronics, Textile & Garment, and Salt Chemicals.

In 2009 ,Changzhou EGing Photovoltaic Technology Co., Ltd. has contributed tax of RMB 212 million.
- ☐ Jintan Photovoltaic Industrial Park was approved by Jiangsu Provincial Government, and covers a planning area of 700 hectares. It includes five functional areas, namely, silicon raw material processing, photovoltaic products manufacturing, photovoltaic equipment manufacturing, research and development, as well as service centers and supporting photovoltaic.

■ Textile & Garment Industry

Jintan is one of the five China Garment Bases for Multinational Purchasing, and focuses on garment OEM processing for export. The local enterprises have established relationship with many famous brands.

- □ Jintan city was awarded the title of "China Famous City for Export Garment Manufacturing" and "China Garment Base for Multinational Purchasing". In 2009, garment exports in Jintan accounts for 1.1% in China, and over 30% of total exports in Jintan. It goes "One out of 20 people in the world wears a Jintan Manufactured piece of garment."

Salt Chemical Industry

With high-end salt mineral resources, Jintan has developed a series of related industries, and planned to exploit downstream industry of fine chemicals.

- ☐ Jintan's salt reserves have excellent mine conditions and are considered the largest salt reserve in the south of the Yangtze River Delta.
- ☐ The excavated space of the mine is used as Gas Storage of "West-East Gas Pipeline" which will both benefit the salt industry and the availability of gas in the region.
- ☐ Jintan has China's largest and Asia's second largest vacuum salt production base. The factories produce 1.2 million tons of vacuum salt for chemical use annually. In addition to this, a factory with an annual output of 250,000 tons of chloro-alkali products has been launched.






■ Development Zones

Costs

Jintan offers investors a low-cost operating environment.

- Land is assigned as Level 9 grade. The lowest benchmark price is 204 RMB/sq. m (or 136,000 RMB/Mu)
- Factory: Average rental can vary, depends on the function and matched condition, ranges from 40 RMB/sq. m/year to 100 RMB/sq. m/year.
- Jintan offers a competitive price package compared to other industrial zones in the YRD.

Transportation

Logistics transportation is convenient as it provides quick access to East China's major transportation network of airports, expressways, ports, and railways.

Expressway

 The Yangzhou-Liyang Expressway, Yangjiang Expressway pass through Jintan and the expressway networks connect Jintan to all major cities of the YRD.

□ Railway

- The Shanghai-Nanjing Speed Railway passes through Changzhou, only 30 km away. Changzhou is the junction for both passenger and freight trains traveling east-west and northsouth in China, with over 190 trains passing through daily and 20-40 TEU cargo deliver capacity.
- The Yanjiang Speed Railway to be constructed passes through Jintan.

□ Airport

- Shanghai Pudong International Airport, Nanjing Lukou International Airport, Hongqiao Airport, Hangzhou Xiaoshan Airport, Changzhou Benniu Airport and Wuxi Shuofang Airport are close to Jintan. Among those, Shanghai Pudong International Airport is 3 hours' drive away from Jintan, and Nanjing Lukou International Airport is only 40 minutes' drive away.
- For freight use, Shanghai Pudong International Airport and Nanjing Lukou International Airport were ranked 1st and 4th respectively in total throughput for mainland China.

■ Waterway

Jintan is 50 km from Changzhou Harbor, 95 km from Zhangjiagang Harbor, and 125 km from Nanjing Harbor. The Jintan canal system connects the Yangtze River which connects the Shanghai Port (200 km) and Yangshan Deep Water Port (230 km). Danjingcao Canal is one of the Beijing-Hangzhou Grand Canal tributaries, linking Jintan with North China.

Logistics Costs

- ☐ Jintan is in close to many ports, including Mainland China's largest port network, Shanghai.
- Shanghai Port: The port of Shanghai surpassed Hong Kong in 2007 to become the second busiest port in the world, just behind Singapore. By 2010, the port is predicted to be the busiest port. Shanghai offer customs clearance, import-export processing services, logistics support, and international shipping lines to all the major ports across the world.
- Zhangjiagang Port: An International port with 23 international lines to over 140 ports in Europe, North America and Asia. Currently the port has 53 berths for 10,000 ton vessels and 33 km of waterfront developed for port activity. The port has established customs clearance and processing that allows for direct international import-export.
- Changzhou Port: Directly connects Jintan via canal system and the Beijing-Hangzhou Grand Canal. The port has 21 km of riverfront developed for port activity. Changzhou port possesses two 10,000 ton berths and numerous 1,000 ton berths. The port runs 10 international lines and many domestic lines within China.

☐ Jintan Possesses a developed waterway system.

The Danjincao River crosses through Jintan, and connects to Yangtze River, is navigable all year round for 500-1,000 ton vessels destinations to ports of Yangtze River and China's eastern coast.

Human Resources

Jintan has high quality talent.

- The Pearl River and Yangtze River Delta are the two largest domestic labor markets, especially in key industries such as Photovoltaic, Mechanical & Electronics, and Textile & Garment, supporting regional economic development.
- The labor market includes Nanjing, Changzhou, Wuxi, Yangzhou, Yixing, Zhenjiang and other major cities in the south Jiangsu Province area. Total new labor arriving in Jintan annually is also approximately 10,000 workers.

☐ The Jintan total labor force is 250,000.

- Total population of the whole Jiintan city is 540,000, but unemployment rate is only 2.02%.
- 250,000 total workers, 45% (about 110,000 people) are skilled workers.
- The education institutions annually produce 2,000 people.
- The vocational schools annually produce 5,000 people.
- □ Changzhou provides a deep labor pool,educational and vocational training infrastructure that Jintan can leverage to broaden and enhance its labor market.

HR Costs

Jintan enjoys low labor costs.

 Companies may have different wage expectations and structure, but on average the following wage levels are indicative of the city.

✓ Worker: 800-1200 RMB/Month

✓ Technical Laborer: 1200-1500 RMB/Month

✓ Management Level: 1500-3000 RMB/Month

□ Companies must pay social welfare on behalf of the staff, which factors into cost estimates.

- The "Labor Laws" stipulate that all enterprises must pay social benefits for their staff, including endowment insurance, unemployment insurance, and medical insurance.
- The following chart shows the Jintan City breakdown:

☐ Jintan is a county/city with a labor cost advantage.

According to the Jiangsu Statistical Yearbook, the average salary of Changzhou employees is higher than the mainland China average, but Jintan's HR cost is lower than its neighboring city, and approximating the Mainland China average.











■ Living Environment

Jintan enjoys a nice living environment with high green ratio which reached 40.85 %, good housing options and many entertainment venues to supply a diverse and rich life.

□ Urban Greenery

 Jintan city has vigorously pursued green projects to promote an ecological way of life an with a higher per capita green area average than the national average.

- Jintan has a large stadium. In addition, leisure center in the 7 towns and the 77 villages are all completed.

□ Residential

Jintan city offers many different residential options, including hotel style apartments, high grade apartments, villas, and moderately priced quality apartments. The average price per square meter is 3,000 RMB for housing space in Jintan.







Health and Medical

Jintan City has 207 health care institutions (including three municipal hospitals), with more than 1,681 beds, that could meet the medical care requirements.

Education

- Jintan has a developed educational system capable of providing investors and their children with good education options.
- The Changzhou International School is 30 km away from Jintan, it provides classes from pre-school to senior high school and has more than 2,000 students, of which 200 are foreign students.

Business Income Tax

In January 1 of 2008, China introduced the new corporate income tax structure which aims to unify the scope, tax rate, preferential tax policies, deductions for both domestic and foreign companies. The new law has revoked the existing five-year tax holiday (i.e. two-year exemption and subsequent three-year 50 percent reduction of applicable tax rate) for newly established manufacturing FIEs. Transitional grandfathering relief has been introduced for qualifying FIEs established prior to the promulgation of the CIT law.

To promote China's economic restructuring and industrial upgrading, the new enterprise income tax law provides for three tax rates:

15% is applies to High Tech companies meeting all required approvals

20% applies to small size companies with comparatively low profits

All other enterprises will be taxed at 25%

- Other taxes include turnover tax, stamp tax, customs, and personal income tax
- Personal Income Tax

Since March 1 of 2008, the standard rate of taxation on wages has since been re-calculated to the following, as represented in the below table:

Note: Personal Income Tax = Taxable Income Tax \times Tax Rate – Deductions (Taxable Income Tax = Salary – 2000). The dividend payment and bonus from foreign investment need not pay for the personal income tax.

The actual fees in Jintan are 1/12 of standard regulation fees, which is competitive than other places. Jintan also implements and strives for full transparency during the process.


Jintan policy aims to unify and standardize fees into a one-time fee during the construction process. The fees cover 16 items (on the left form) and form a final and total charge of RMB 12/sq.m.

Jintan implements a zero charge policy, which signifies that besides the regulation fees, there is no other additional fees derived from the government.



Land Usage

- ☐ Regulations for transfer / grant land rights use state that Jintan shall be responsible for the matters relating to transfer and grant of use rights of state-owned land for valuable consideration and both domestic and overseas investors are welcomed to invest in land in Jintan.
- Zones of land use, land transfer up to a maximum of 70 years, of which the industrial land is generally no more than 50 years, and land for commercial, entertainment, tourism do not generally exceed more than 40 years, and finally the residential land have use rights for 70 years.
- □ A Chinese partner can transfer the land use right to a joint venture as a part of its investment or cooperation term for undertaking development and construction with overseas investors.
- Land must be used in compliance with the overall plan and subject to the overall industrial layout of the development zones with the aim of environmental protection.

Note: During Pre-Construction Phase, projects must apply for the following procedures:

- Obtain constructional projects approval certificate or filing records, in Development & Reform Bureau
- Obtain license of the usage of the construction land, in Planning Bureau
- Obtain construction land approval, in Land & Resources Bureau
- Obtain constructural planning project for approval, in Planning Bureau
- Obtain certification of construction engineering, in Construction Bureau
